Entry Requirements

Prior to enrolling your proficiency in language, literacy and numeracy will be assessed to determine any support requirements.

The program is open to all school students.

Delivery Method

This qualification is delivered via a combination of online and classroom based sessions. Students will attend a full day session each week at school, followed by online assessments.

Course Price

VETIS Funding Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible to enrol in the VET in Schools (VETiS) program, you must:

- Be enrolled at school (Year 10, 11 or 12)
- Be a Queensland resident
- Be an Australian or New Zealand Citizen, or Australian permanent resident, or a temporary resident with the necessary visa and work permits on the pathway to permanent residency.
