- Customising the marketing materials; poster, flyers, business cards;
- Reviewing the Next Steps data;
- Researching and reading there is an overwhelming amount of resources to become familiar with;

- Last week Link and Launch reached an important program milestone when the number of clients with a record status of 'Transitioned' surpassed one thousand! This means that there are more than 1000 young Queenslanders who have made a successful transition and who no longer require the active support of a Link and Launch officer.
